It is a concept that goes by many names: vehicle infrastructure integration (VII) in the United States, cooperative systems (CS) in Europe. Around the world, these partners are working together to evaluate the technical, economic, and socio/political feasibility of deploying a communications system whose purpose is to achieve dramatic improvements in the safety and efficiency of the surface transportation system. There has been much speculation about the projected impacts of VI /CS and many futuristic scenarios have been presented. The first session will be an introduction to VI /VIC activities being conducted around the world, focusing on Europe, Japan, and the U.S. The second session will be a facilitated discussion on VI /CS deployment challenges and how these challenges can be overcome. In the third session, experts from the ITS evaluation community will present the latest findings from evaluations being conducted around the world on exactly what are the benefits and costs of VI /CS . The fourth session will consist of a facilitated discussion on how to share information internationally on VI /CS activities and evaluation results.

As part of the 11th Avenue Theater Show, SafeTrip-21 will show how new readily available wireless technologies can be used to improve vehicle and pedestrian safety.
